## **Notice of Race (NoR)**

Preamble	The notation '[DP]' in a rule in the SI means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.	
1	RULES	
1.1	The event is governed by the rules as defined in <i>The Racing Rules of Sailing</i> .	
1.2	PHRF-LE Class rules shall apply. Class rules for one-design classes shall apply.	
1.3	The rules of The Cleveland Yacht Racing Association (CYRA) shall apply	
1.4	US Sailing prescription to RRS 63.2 shall not apply.	
2	SAILING INSTRUCTIONS	
2.1	The sailing instructions will be available online no later than midnight on May 12, 2024 at <a href="www.cyra.us">www.cyra.us</a> . The sailing instructions will also be emailed to all registered competitors.	
3	COMMUNICATION	
3.1	The online official notice board is located at <u>www.cyra.us</u> .	
3.2	[DP] All boats shall carry a VHF radio capable of communicating on Channel 69.	
3.3	On the water, the race committee may make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio.	
3.4	[DP] While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats. This includes mobile telephones.	
4	ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY	
4.1	The event is open to all boats whose owners are current members of the CYRA, have a valid PHRF-LE certificate, PHRF-SS certificate or a current one-design measurement certificate. First year members may have a non-negotiable rating assigned by the race committee that is only applicable to CYRA racing for that year.

## 7 EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

- 7.1 [DP] All equipment required by Federal, State, and Local authorities and class rules for sailing purposes shall be carried while afloat.
- **7.2** Boats may be inspected at any time.
- **7.3** [DP] Boats shall comply with RRS 78.1

## 8 VENUE

**8.1** Racing will take place inside the eastern end of Cleveland harbor and on the waters of Lake Erie.

## 9 COURSES

**9.1** Race Courses: A chart of the numbered courses is available under Racing at <a href="https://www.cyra.us">www.cyra.us</a>.

## 10 PENALTY SYSTEM

10.1 RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty, however, RRS 44.1(a) and (b) apply.

## 11 SCORING

- **11.1** Each series shall be scored separately.
- One (1) race is required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 11.3 The scoring system is as described in App A2 with the following modifications:
- 11.3.a RRS A5.2 is changed as follows: a boat that did not start and did not come to the starting area (DNC) shall be scored the number of starters in that race plus two points.
- 11.3.b RRS A5.2 is changed as follows: a boat that came to the starting area but did not start (DNS or OCS), shall be scored the number of starters in that race plus one point.
- 11.3.c RRS A5.2 is changed as follows: a boat that started, but did not sail the course (NSC), did not finish (DNF), retired (RET) or is disqualified (DSQ) shall be scored the number of starters in that race plus one point.

A boat's specific series score shall be the total of her race scores excluding her worst scores based on the schedule below.

# 12. RISK STATEMENT

RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.

#### 13. INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$300,000.00 per incident or the equivalent. Proof of insurance must be provided upon request.

#### 14. PRIZES

14.1 If five or more boats compete in a class in any series, awards will be made for first, second and third places.

If four boats compete, awards will be made for first and second place only. If three or fewer boats compete, only first place will receive an award.

The Schnagle-Murphy Cup will be presented to the PHRF boat with the lowest points total for all four series.

The Commodore Depner Trophy will be presented to the JAM boat with the lowest points total for all four series.

The Sportsman of the Year Trophy may be awarded. Nominations for this trophy can be made to the CYRA Bridge.

#### Referenced Rules

#### A5.2.

A boat that did not <u>start</u>, did not <u>sail the course</u>, did not <u>finish</u>, retired or was disqualified shall be scored points for the finishing place one more than the number of boats entered in the series. A boat that is penalized under rule 30.2 or that takes a penalty under rule 44.3(a) shall be scored points as provided in rule 44.3(c).

### 44.1. Taking a Penalty

A boat may take a Two-Turns Penalty when she may have broken one or more rules of Part 2 in an incident while <u>racing</u>. She may take a One-Turn Penalty when she may have broken rule 31. Alternatively, the notice of race or sailing instructions may specify the use of the Scoring Penalty or some other penalty, in which case the specified penalty shall replace the One-Turn and the Two-Turns Penalty. However,

- 1. when a boat may have broken a rule of Part 2 and rule <u>31</u> in the same incident she need not take the penalty for breaking rule 31;
- 2. if the boat caused injury or serious damage or, despite taking a penalty, gained a significant advantage in the race or series by her breach her penalty shall be to retire.

#### 63.2. Time and Place of the Hearing; Time for Parties to Prepare

All <u>parties</u> to the hearing shall be notified of the time and place of the hearing, the <u>protest</u> or redress information or the allegations shall be made available to them, and they shall be allowed reasonable time to prepare for the hearing. When two or more hearings arise from the same incident, or from very closely connected incidents, they may be heard together in one hearing. However, a hearing conducted under rule 69 shall not be combined with any other type of hearing.

#### **78.1.**

While a boat is <u>racing</u>, her owner and any other person in charge shall ensure that the boat is maintained to comply with her class rules and that her measurement or rating certificate, if any, remains valid. In addition, the boat shall also comply at other times specified in the class rules, the notice of race or the sailing instructions.
